

St. Patrick's Day honours Ireland's patron saint, the beloved religious leader who, in the latter part of the fourth century, brought Christianity to a **pagan** nation. Americans of Irish **descent** celebrate the anniversary of his death on March 17.

Strangely enough, the patron saint of Ireland was not Irish either by birth or heritage. Born in what is now Scotland or England, he was the son of Roman citizens. When he was 16 years old, he was captured by pirates and brought to Ireland, where he was sold as a slave. He spent six years in slavery in Ireland. During this time, he saw the Irish **worshipping idols** and dreamed of bringing them Christianity. When he escaped, he went to France, where he studied religion and later became a **monk**. He eventually returned to Ireland, where he **preached** Christianity and established more than 300 churches.

St. Patrick is the favourite saint of the Irish, who tell many stories about his kind deeds and miraculous powers. He is even given credit for driving the snakes out of Ireland!


In the United States, St. Patrick's Day is celebrated with parades, church services, banquets, and the wearing of the green. St. Patrick used the three-leaf clover (the **shamrock**) to explain the **Trinity**, which refers to the unity of the Father (God), the Son (Jesus), and the Holy Ghost (the Holy Spirit). Today, green cloth shamrocks and green clothing are worn by people of Irish descent on St. Patrick's Day.

In New York City, Boston, Philadelphia, Chicago, and Atlanta, there are **spectacular** St. Patrick's Day **parades**. The **marchers** wear native Irish costumes and carry colourful **banners** and flags. Bands play familiar songs about Ireland. Observers crowd the sidewalks to watch the fun and sing or hum along with the marchers. In Chicago, as part of the celebration, the Chicago River is dyed green.






Task 6


